Outdoor Youth Group Programs

- Animal Tracks & Sign: Learn how to find and read animal tracks and sign. Make a plaster animal track to take home.
- Snowshoeing: Learn how to snowshoe and explore Iowa's wintry wonderland. Snowshoes provided.
- Fishing: Learn the basics of how to use a rod and reel. Practice casting and try your luck at fishing. Rods and reels provided.
- Canoeing Basics: Learn how to canoe safely at Central Park Lake.
 Six canoes available for group use.
- Tree ID: Learn how to identify lowa trees by bark, twigs, and leaves.
- Bird Watching: Learn how to identify lowa's birds. (12 pair of binoculars available for group use.)
- Aquatic Water Investigation: Examine the water quality of a pond or stream. Use hand nets to capture live pond critters.
- Poisonous Plant Hike: Learn about some of the poisonous plants to avoid while hiking in Iowa.



Indoor Programs:



- Iowa's Snakes: Learn about Iowa's snakes. Live snakes used.
- Iowa's Turtles: Learn about Iowa's turtles. Live turtles used.
- lowa's Mammals: What furry critters are in your backyard???
 Examine pelts and skulls.
- All About Owls: Learn how to hoot like an owl.
- Bird Feeding Basics: Learn how to feed the birds and make a simple bird feeder to take home.
- Water Quality: Learn how our waters can become polluted by run
 off and learn what you can do to help.
- lowa's Endangered and Threatened Animals: Learn what animals are endangered or threatened in Iowa and what simple steps you can take to help them survive.
- lowa's Breeding Birds: Learn about some of the birds that call lowa home and how we can all help provide the habitat they need to survive. Build a bird house.
